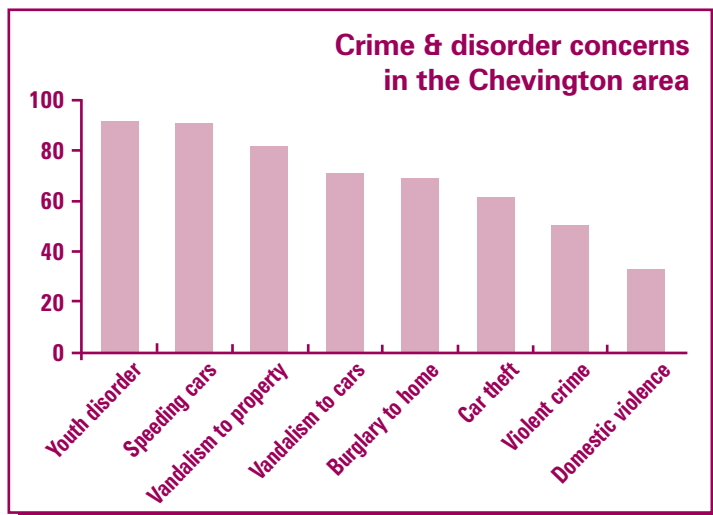


Chevington Beat Newsletter

- Vandalism

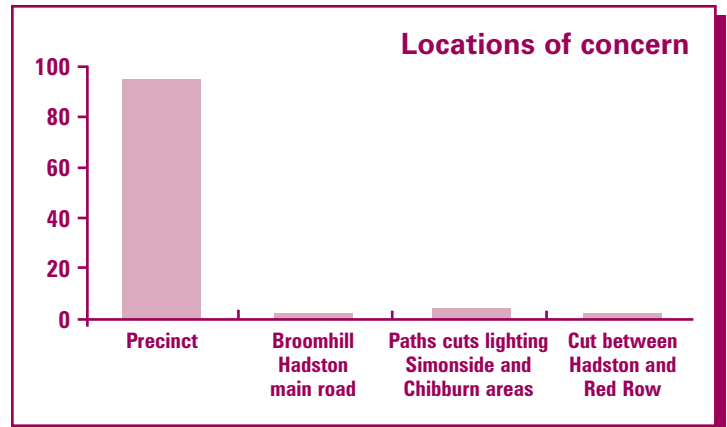


Action Planning

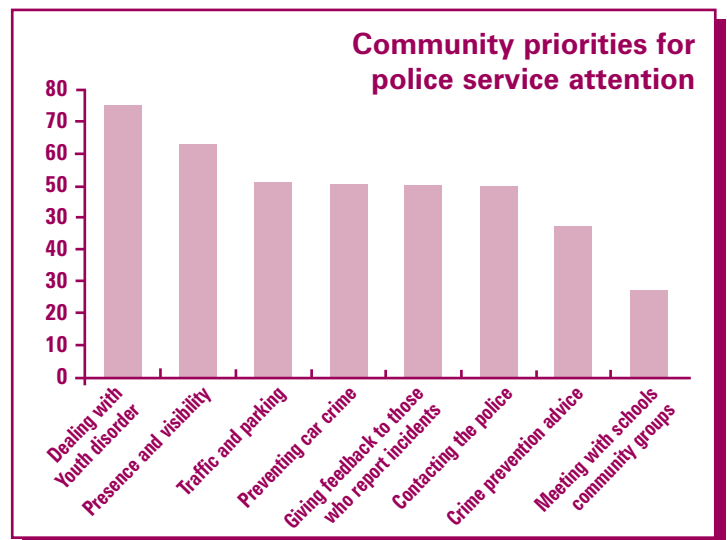
From the Chevington Beat survey and the beat meetings the clear priorities for action are

- Youth Disorder
- Vandalism
- The Precinct
- Improving visibility and police presence
- Traffic and speeding

Safety: 50% of residents said they felt safe after dark in the Chevington area, and over 90% said they felt safe during the day.



Places where you have most concern are the shops and precinct area with the majority of residents who expressed a preference saying this was the area where they had most concern.



In terms of police services, the areas where you felt the police should concentrate are:

- Dealing with youth disorder
- Providing a more visible presence
